Comes the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by counsel, Elizabeth Jones Brown, Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney for the 30th Judicial District of Kentucky, and in accordance with the Court's Pretrial Order of Discovery, states as follows:

The Bill of Particulars contained within the Commonwealth's Response to the Court's Order of Discovery had some words which were inadvertently omitted. The Bill of Particulars is as follows:

On August 23, 2010, the defendant removed a Play Station 3 from the evidence shelf of the Louisville Metro Police Department Property Room, along with a printer and an amplifier, and placed them in a dumpster in order to steal them from the Louisville Metro Police Department. The defendant used the same method to also steal from the property room two digital cameras which were recovered from his home on August 30, 2010.

Between August 25, 2010 and August 30, 2010, the defendant visited three different doctors and filled four prescriptions based on misrepresentations to the doctors. Defendant received a total of 105 Hydrocodone pills and 40 Oxycodone pills during this six day period.
